 packed Newsletter.



Presidents Corner

A Hot Summer with Hot Topics

Bylaws, Board Elections, Committees, & Ambassadors



Tis the season to be elected! You can be elected to the board of directors, to a working group chair, or to an ambassador position. You can even get involved in fixing the consitution, by-laws, or operational plan (all accessible on the Operational Documentation Folder of the Library Tab).

What is so important about the By-Laws? Our operational documentation is not always correct. Mistakes need to be corrected. For more than ten years the BoD was elected using paper ballots during a regular membership meeting.

What did the by-laws say? They specified "balloting by mail." George Anderson saw this while we were writing the 2011 Operational Plan and found a way to fix it. You will be asked to approve this fix in the August meeting (see George's article below).

This fall, you "the membership" will be electing a president-elect (or vice president), treasurer, secretary, program director, membership director, and communications director. As of January 1st, our president elect Gundars Osvalds will become the new President. He and the other new officers will take charge. I become an ex-officio member of the board (past president). According to the operating plan, the working directors are asked to select supporting committees. Especially important are the highly visible membership, programs, and communications posts. You may want to serve on one of these committees. No election is required for these positions.

Less obvious are the working group chairs. The Chesapeake Chapter has had a long standing working group called Object Oriented Systems Engineering Methodology (OOSEM). The working groups are the technical and professional core activities of the chapter. Systems Engineer Certification has been a big push. Another high impact area is Model-Based Systems Engineering (MBSE).

Finally, there are the ambassadors. These are the interfaces between companies, universities, and other professional societies. At the simplest level, they forward announcements into internal networks and promote sharing of content among chapters.

Then you need to pass a two-hour, 120-question, multiple-choice exam. The Era of Quality-Based Management Systems

One Man's Irreverent View

In our industrial and information industries, the management theories relating to increasing business efficiency and their offspring, quality practices, are proliferating at an increased rate in almost every category of commerce. I would suggest that an era of employing quality theories to address management problems began shortly after World War II. During this period, serious attempts were made to create theories that would maximize the



efficiency of industrial and business processes. At some point, when an analytic connection was made between customer satisfaction and process development, *quality* as a service industry was born.

The first imperative in understanding quality programs is to recognize that the profit motive is a prime motivator. Commercial or non-profit entities exist for the business purpose of selling their services and intellectual property to clients who are seeking certification or other recognition. The cash flow of quality has both national and international winners and losers and competition among the systems is intense.

What are the primary quality programs or systems in the US today? Based on market penetration in Government and Industry, I would suggest that five deserve examination. These are:
