## [17 September, 2014 \(6:00 - 8:00 PM\): Big Data Intelligence: 360 analytical security](#)

**Presentation:** Security data is used to analyze activities and metrics associated with risk management, incident detection/response, regulatory compliance, and investigations/forensics. Many of these investigations now include analysis of nontraditional data sources such as social media, customer browsing history, and business transactions. To support business requirements, manage risk, and respond to security events, CISOs collect, retain, and analyze a larger repository of data than they did in the past. Security data growth and utilization will only increase in the future. In this session, we will discuss IBM's comprehensive approach leveraging a deep portfolio of security analytics to improve situational awareness at the federal mission level, and how

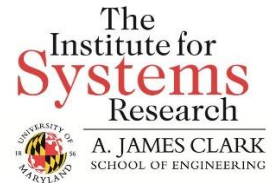
mission planners can harness the power of Big Data through advanced security, predictive and entity analytics as a preemptive defense from external and internal threats.

This program explores how we got here and looks anew at the need to take a “systems view.” Our goal

Human systems engineering is a comprehensive program for considering the requirements and constraints of humans as part of an overall system solution. The Johns Hopkins University Engineering for Professionals (EP) Human Systems Engineering

concentration trains students in the human systems integration domains and their interdependencies as well as provides additional material related to general human systems engineering. Students gain a deeper understanding of how the appropriate application of human systems engineering adds value to systems.

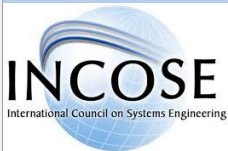
